HISTORY

The Jersey Biodiversity Centre (the 'JBC') opened in 2013 with the participation and support of Environment Guernsey Ltd., the Société Jersiaise and the States of Jersey Department of the Environment. Since then the database of natural history and biological records has been continually expanded and are now holds over 420,000 biological records, representing over 8,000 species.

The JBC was registered in 2019 as a Jersey Registered Charity no 230 with the stated aim to collect and computerise Jersey's natural history and biological records so that these can be used by amateur and professional naturalists, ecologists and other researchers.

During 2022 the JBC was registered as a business with the Government of Jersey and the Jersey Biodiversity Centre was registered as a business name. The links with the Société Jersiase were loosed with the appointment of HR Now to act as HR and payroll consultants. Sadly, Michelle Gray, our centre manager resigned leaving a vacancy which is due to be filled in the New Year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 ACCOUNTING CONVENTIONS

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

2 ACCOUNTING FOR INCOME

All donations and income are accounted for on an accruals basis. Any surplus donations are capitalised at the beginning of the new year

3 ACCOUNTING FOR EXPENSES

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs relating to that category.

The JBC Committee members receive no remuneration. It is the policy of the JBC to reimburse reasonable expenses incurred exclusively on behalf of the JBC.

4 CASH AT BANK

During the last quarter of the year the banking facilities provided by NatWest International were subject issues following the change of the committee and the resignation of M Gray. This resulted in problems in settling any expense invoices and staff wages. These issues were covered by the Societe Jersiase until full banking services were reinstated in November.

7 Service provision agreement

The JBC has agreed with the Government of Jersey (Inrastructure, Housing and Environment) to provide the collection, management and maintainance data cleaning entering, exporting and analysing Jersey biological data for the year to 31 December 2022 for a current fee of £15,000.

It is anticipated that a new agreement for the year ended 31 December 2023 will be completed early in 2023.
